

Thatching and Aeration

Service

- Thatching and aeration are typically done in spring and fall to keep lawns healthy.
- Thatching removes dead plant material from lawns to improve water, sun, and nutrient penetration.
- Aeration creates holes in the turf to reduce compaction and allow for further water and nutrient penetration.
- Thatching and aeration are often followed by spreading grass seed over the lawn to fill in where moss and thatch have been removed.
- Overseeding results are easier to achieve in fall, because the weather cools down and rain becomes more frequent. The new grass blades will go dormant in winter, then continue to fill in when spring arrives. Overseeding in spring means watering the new grass regularly throughout summer. There is no warranty on germination.
- Fertilizer can be added after overseeding to help existing grass recover and grow while supporting new grass germination.
- A thin layer of compost and sand mix can be added over new grass seed and fertilizer to help seat the seed, provide nutrients, and hide the new seed from birds.

Invoicing

- Thatching and aeration projects are bid individually.
- There is a 50% deposit required for thatching and aeration quotes. These can be made by credit card through emailed quotes.
